



## Active Shooter Incident Management

Lessons learned from large scale / rapidly evolving active shooter incidents have shown how Police officers stopping the active threat is only the first challenge to saving lives. To really tackle the subsequent moving parts and protect lives, there must be effective integrated response from Police, Fire, and EMS personnel. South Central Task Force has been reaching out with presentations and exercise facilitation of the rescue task force integrated response model to create the discussion, planning, and training to make that happen.

Successful response to the many dynamics of such an incident will also require the immediate establishment of effective but flexible command in a form not necessarily addressed by typical unified command concepts. We must recognize that those early but critical decisions will fall on the shoulders of multi-disciplinary field personnel who might have little actual command experience. This Active Shooter Incident Management course will address those initial challenges through instruction, discussion, and instructor facilitated role-play.
